Latin Present Subjunctive 4th Conjugation IRE Verbs

4th Conjugation Verbs are nearly identical to 3rd ERE I stems. (No eris)*

Review the steps for the Indicative Mood of the IRE verb (Dormio).

Step 1- Look at the four Principal Parts.	dormio - dormire - dormivi - dormitus (a-um)
Step 2- Identify the 2nd Principal Part (infinitive)	dormire
Step 3- Drop the RE	dormi
Step 4- Add the personal endings	o-s-t-mus-tis-nt

Change the Indicative Mood (IRE) to the Subjunctive Mood (IRE) by adding an (a) after the Indicative present stem. (Dormio to Dormiam)

Indicative Present IRE

Subjunctive Present IRE

dormio	dormiam
dormis	dormias
dormit	dormiat
dormimus	dormiamus
dormitis	dormiatis
dormiunt*	dormiant

Just add Passive endings to form both the Present Indicative Passive and the Present Subjunctive Passive.

To make the verb Passive just substitute Passive personal endings.
